	Given our performance in 2022/23, it was clear we needed a plan to reduce	
	losses, otherwise we would run out of money!	
	We produced a forecast for 2023/24 with monthly sales and a gross margin	
	that would allow us to break even , assuming forecast costs were accurate –	
	then agreed some actions we believed would help us deliver these numbers.	
	 For the first 5 months of 2023/24, we have exceeded this sales plan by 1%, 	
	and have achieved the gross margin target.	
	Sales are 22% ahead of last year – with price inflation representing approx.	
	50% of this growth (In terms of sales we had our best ever May, June & July)	
	Footfall, measured by number of transactions, is 13% up on the year for the	
	first 5 months.	
	 Overall, we are in a break-even position for the year to date – but know we have challenges to maintain this for the remaining 7 months
